Minutes of Meeting

Sixteenth Meeting of State Ganga Committee (SGC), Uttarakhand dated 18.01.2024

The sixteenth meeting of Uttarakhand State Ganga Committee was held under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary, Govt. of Uttarakhand on 18.01.2024 at Chief Secretary Meeting Hall, Uttarakhand Secretariat. The meeting was attended by Ex-officio members of SGC or their representatives, along with officials from concerned departments and all the Chairman of the District Ganga Committees (DGCs) of the Districts of Garhwal and Kumaon divisions via video conferencing from their respective NIC centers. The list of participants is annexed.

At the outset, Program Director (PD), State Program Management Group (SPMG) welcomed the Chairman, Members and Chairman of the District Ganga Committees and apprised the Committee about the constitution and mandate of State Ganga Committee along with decisions taken in the fifteenth meeting of SGC.

PD, SPMG apprised to the committee that under Namami Gange Program, rejuvenation of the river Ganga has been considered in holistic manner with a basin approach including its tributaries. The concept for rejuvenation incorporates Nirmal, Aviral, Gyan, Jan Ganga with concept of Arth Ganga added to it in 2019.

Thereafter the agenda wise discussion held and decisions taken are as follows:

Agenda 1: Compliance of Decisions taken in 15th meeting of Uttarakhand State Ganga Committee (SGC):

Program Director apprised to the committee that the District Ganga Committees has appointed Gram Pradhan as the Nodal for the Gram Sabhas along the banks of the River Ganga and its tributaries, as well as the Chairperson for Nagar Panchayats and Nagar Palika Parishads, covering various revenue villages/wards adjacent to the River Ganga and its tributaries.

Constitution of Stretch wise Local Community Groups has been formed in every village under the chairmanship of Gram Pradhan of the area around river Ganga and its tributaries by the involvement of Ganga Prahari/Ganga Mitras/NGOs for conducting the various activities like; wall painting, cleanliness programme, Prabhat Pheri and general knowledge competition etc.

Regular IEC activities are being organized at village level with the aim to integrate the people in the basin for Ganga rejuvenation.

Chairman emphasized that as per the mandate, all the District Magistrates while exercising their powers must convene regular meetings on every month and monitor the progress of the activities being executed by the executing agencies to prevent environment pollution in the river

Ganga and its tributaries. Local community groups to be engaged by all the DGCs and organise sensitization programs together with them to integrate people in different components of Namami Gange program for river restoration.

(Actions: District Magistrates, DGCs)

1.1 Status of sewerage infrastructure under Namami Gange program:

- Program Director apprised to the Committee that under Namami Gange Program, total 42 projects have been approved for the installation of 62 nos. of STPs to create 244.48 MLD capacity, out of Which 36 projects had been completed by installing 42 nos. of STPs with the capacity of 165MLD and rest 06 nos. of projects are in different stage of execution.
- It was also apprised that as per the analysis report of Uttarakhand Pollution Control Board (UKPCB) for the month of November, 2023, it has been observed that 16 STPs are non-complying as per NGT norms. As per the third party report, conducted by Uttarakhand Jal Nigam and Jal Sansthan, 09 STPs are complying as per NGT norms & 07 STPs are complying as per MoEF&CC norms for which the Jal Nigam is preparing the DPR for their up-gradation.

Chairman directed Jal Nigam to accelerate the execution/tendering of the sanctioned projects by NMCG and also keep the vigilant monitoring for completion of all the projects on scheduled timelines. Jal Nigam & Jal Sansthan must ensure the environmental compliances of all the operational STPs. He directed if required, the DPR should be prepared to meet out the Hon'ble NGT norms at the earliest and submitted through SPMG to NMCG for approval.

(Action: SPMG, Uttarakhand Pey Jal Nigam, Jal Santhan)

1.2 Status of Septage Management in Ganga towns: -

Urban Development Department (UDD), apprised to the committee that as per Uttarakhand Protocol for Septage Management, Septage Management Committee (SMC) has been formed in all 92 towns/ULBs. In 10 newly created Urban Local Bodies (ULBs), it is in the process. ULBs are in the process of implementation/enforcement of Septage Management Protocol (SMP) in all towns. 210 Septage suction (ULB, Jal Sansthan & Private owned) and transportation vehicles are available in 92 ULBs are using Suction Vehicles of the nearby towns. Based upon the 'Model Bye Laws for Septage Management' developed by UDD in cooperation with GIZ & NIUA, for fixing user charges and registration of private septage suction vehicles, Bye Laws has been customized, of the 92 ULB's where SMC has been formed, Gazette notification has been done by 58 ULB's, rest are in progress. Detailed HH survey for Rishikesh, Muni-Ki-Reti has been done and actions initiated by the ULBs. Also Devprayag, Badrinath and Gangotri done by joint effort of Jal Nigam, Jal Sansthan and ULBs. Other ULBs are in the process as per SBM 2.0. Recently, State has taken conscious decision that in every proposed STP, co-treatment facility for fecal sludge will be incorporated in the DPR.

Chairman directed UDD/ULBs to constitute SMCs in the 10 newly formed ULBs within 15 days. Further UDD /SMCs to expedite user charges bylaws notification, Households survey in all the ULBs for effective implementation of septage management interventions in accordance with the

State Septage Management Protocol. Also co-treatment facility to be incorporated in the new STPs projects.

(Action: UDD, ULBs, UKPJN & UJS)

1.3 Flood Plain Zoning: -Detail of flood plain zoning in Uttarakhand:

- Irrigation Department updated that the Notification of 614.60 KM River Stretches (Alaknanda, Bhagirathi, Mandakini, Bhilangna and Ganga) as Flood Plain Zone under the Uttarakhand Flood Plain Zone Act, 2012.
- Flood Plain Zoning is under progress of 398.7 KM in the River Stretches (Suswa, Gola, Kosi and Song). 01 stretch of Ganga River is notified. Study for rest 3 river Kosi, Suswa & Kichha / Gola Song is completed & will be notified by March, 2024.
- Proposal of bandha/ Astha path along the right bank of river Ganga between Pashulok Barrage (Rishikesh) to Dudhiya bandh (Hardwar) has been proposed.

Chairman directed Irrigation Department to notify the flood plain zoning for the remaining river stretches (Suswa, Gola, Kosi and Song) within the set timelines. Further the proposed bandha in the notified stretches to be expedited.

(Action: Irrigation Department)

Agenda 2:

2.1). Forestry Interventions:

Regarding Forestry Intervention for Ganga, it was informed by the Project Director that under the Namami Gange Project, instructions were received to finance the new plantation work through CAMPA. Hence, only maintenance of the old plantation work, agriculture work, urban landscape work and tree plantation work done by Eco Task Force is permissible. It was also informed that the work of agricultural nursery and riverfront development etc. established under urban landscape item has been completely damaged during the disaster that occurred in the last rainy season in Hanwal River, Shivpuri. No amount has been obtained for the year 2023-24, for the maintenance of Ganga vatika.

Chairman directed that demand for release of budget for the maintenance of old plantations, Ganga Vatika maintenance, plantation by Eco Task Force and operational expenses of PMU be sent to NMCG, immediately. CAMPA funds needs to be effectively used for afforestation at appropriate locations along the banks of Ganga and its tributaries.

(Action: Forest Department).

Agenda 2.2: Social Audit of the STPs constructed under Namami Gange Program:

- As per directions made in the 13th State Ganga Committee meeting, the Social and Environmental Audit of 10 STPs (Badrinath-01, Joshimath - 01, Kirtinagar-01, Srinagar - 01, Rudraprayag - 01, Karanprayag- 01, Nandprayag-01, Gopeshwar-02, Chamoli-01 and Srikot-01) were conducted by SPMG, Namami Gange Uttarakhand through engaging TPA- HNB Garhwal University (A Central University), Srinagar.
- As per the directions in the 15th meeting of the State Ganga Committee, finding of the audit report sent by SPMG dated 18.07.2023 to the executing agencies for compliance.

- Also request for proposal has been issued from SPMG to conduct Environmental and Social Audit in the remaining STPs by engaging State level institutions and universities located at the following places i.e. i. Ramnagar, Nainital, ii. Rishikesh iii. Haridwariv. Dehradun

Chairman directed to get the audit of the remaining operational STPs completed before the next meeting through involving different institutions. Also compliance of the recommendations of the Social Audit done earlier must be ensured.

(Actions: SPMG, UKPJN & UJS).

Agenda 3: Status of Solid Waste Management along the Ganga and its tributaries

Status of Solid Waste management along the Ganga and its tributaries was presented by *Urban Development Directorate (UDD)*, as total waste generated 1958 metric ton per day (mtpd) against which 1256 (mtpd) waste is being treated in the 07 functional integrated Solid Waste Management plants and 07 Integrated Solid Waste Management Projects/Plants are under progress. Further it was updated that Environmental clearance is required from SEIAA for the Chamoli landfill site

Chairman directed UDD to ensure proper solid waste management in all the towns on the bank of river Ganga and its tributaries in co-ordination with ULBs. Further it was directed UDD to pursue with State Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA) for Environmental clearance of Chamoli landfill site.

(Action: Urban Development Department, Forest department).

Agenda 4: Integration of sustainable Economic Development "Arth Ganga" model under Namami Gange Programme as envisioned by Hon'ble Prime Minister in the 1st Meeting of the National Ganga Council held on 14th December, 2019:

06 verticals of Arth Ganga had been presented by Program Director, SPMG and the concerned departments for Clean Ganga, are as follows:

i. Zero Budget Natural Farming:

National mission on natural farming is proposed to be implemented in 6400 ha area of the state. Out of this area, 1000 ha area of district Uttarakashi and Dehradun under Ganga basin is selected for promoting of natural farming.

In addition to this Namami Gange Prakartik Krishi Corridor Scheme is proposed under state scheme for implementation of National mission on natural farming in 5 Kms corridor of Ganga river in 39 clusters (1950 ha) of district Tehri, Pauri, Chamoli and Uttarakashi.

Formation of Organic and Natural farming Board is in under process.

In the State, 29 State, district and village level training programmes and workshops have been organized to train approx. 6327 farmers for Natural Farming practices. 1277 farmers of all Districts have trained in KVK of respective district and 250 farmers have participated in Training programme held at Kuruchhetra, Haryana.

Organic Farming:-

1.53 lakh ha. area is covered under Organic farming under Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yojana (PKVY), Rastriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) and Namami Gange scheme along the river bank of Ganga.

- Organic farming is promoted in 840 ha. of 42 villages situated at Ganga Basin as per PKVY guideline under phase-I of Swachhta Action plan: Namami Gange Clean Abhiyan. In phase-II, this scheme is being implemented in 50000 ha. with integration of horticulture, agro forestry suitable for region/local area and promotion of water use efficiency through micro irrigation in Ganga Districts in convergence with Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH), Bamboo mission/ other agro forestry scheme and Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY) scheme respectively. Organic products produced under the project are being marketed with Namami Gange-Organic Uttarakhand Brand name.

ii. Monetization of Reuse of Sludge & Wastewater:

Reuse of treated water of 113 MLD (45 + 68 MLD) at Jagjeetpur is being used in Irrigation.

In STP complex at Jagjeetpur Haridwar, 03 STPs of total capacity 113 MLD are functional. Irrigation department has constructed approx. 11 kms long main canal from STP complex Jagjeetpur and also constructed distributaries from main canal to irrigate the agriculture fields as per the crop water demand. At present, treated water is supplied to local farmers for irrigation in Jagjeetpur, Missarpur and panjhaneri area (around 593 Bigha) free of cost through a wide network of treated water line.

Sludge Management:-

From Jagjeetpur and Sarai STPs at Haridwar 53741 m³ Sludge has been distributed free of cost to local farmers for agricultural activities.

Chairman while intervening into the matter emphasized that gravity based action plan needs to be formulated for the application of sludge generated from the STPs at Udham Singh Nagar in the agriculture activities.

iii. Livelihood Generation Opportunities

- JALAJ Livelihood Model - Implementation in progress at 37 locations to be replicated at 75 locations by Wildlife Institute of India (WII), Dehradun;
- Project on 'Capacity Building Programme for Leveraging Community and Local Resources Based on Technology' with HESCO - various training programmes are being conducted at village level;
- Promotion of Home Stay, Ganga Trails, Jungle walks, Tourism Guides, Aarti at Ghats etc.
- Ghat Mein Haat for marketing of local produce.



iv. Culture Heritage & Tourism:

Audio Video Facility for the Ganga Arti being developed at Har-ki-Pauri, Haridwar. Pandit Deen Dayal homestay Vikas Yojana is being availed by many villagers to develop homestay promoting sustainable tourism. Ganga Avalokan'- A museum on Ganga at Chandi-Ghat, has been set up at Haridwar and Ganga Museum' developed at Triveni Ghat, Rishikesh under Namami Gange Program.

v. Public Participation:

To integrate people in the basin with Ganga Rejuvenation, SPMG in collaboration with different institutions and NGOs has successfully conducted about 381 IEC activities from 2017 to 2023. The major programs conducted are *Swachhta Pakhwada / Swachhta Hi Sewa, Awareness Campaigns and Exhibitions and Public awareness activities.*

vi. Institutional Building:

It was apprised to the committee that 15 meetings of State Ganga Committees has been held from 2017 to 2023. Regular DGCs meetings being held (112 meetings between April-2023 to December 2023). Regular handholding of District Ganga Committees on Ganga Rejuvenation interventions is done. District Chamoli, Uttarakhand has been awarded the Prime Minister's Award for Excellence in Public Administration, 2020 for successful implementation of the Government of India Programme "Namami Gange" in District Chamoli in Uttarakhand. Trainings for all 13 DGCs conducted by NMCG-GIZ together with SPMG for preparation of District Ganga Plan.

Chairman emphasized that all the above activities of Arth Ganga are being implemented in co-ordination with various departments to achieve the objectives of 'Arth Ganga' Model. Proper mechanism to be adopted to achieve the on-ground impact of the training and workshops and motivate the farmers to uptake the zero budget natural farming under the aegis of Arth Ganga. Further formulate an action plan for the application of sludge generated from the STPs at Udham Singh Nagar in the agriculture activities.

(Actions: All the Concerned Departments)

Agenda 5: Strengthening of District Ganga Committees (DGCs):

District Ganga Committees are conducting regular monthly, mandated, monitored, minuted (4M) meetings in all the districts. Also, the minutes of meeting (MoM) are regularly being uploaded to the dedicated GDPMS portal designed by NMCG. During the assessment year 2022-23, total 112 nos. of minutes of meetings (MoM) were uploaded over GDPMS portal, out of total 117 meetings of District Ganga Committees.

Comprehensive District Ganga Plan of Udham Singh Nagar prepared with support of GIZ has been discussed and approved in a meeting by Director General, NMCG on 08th January, 2024. Trainings for all other 12 DGCs conducted by NMCG-GIZ together with SPMG for preparation of District Ganga Plan.

Chairman emphasized that the projects planned in future should be aligned in accordance with the approved plan.

Thereafter Chief Secretary, took a district wise brief note on the key issues within the district for rejuvenation of river Ganga, there speedy solution and disposal, which are as follows.

i. Rudraprayag:

District Magistrates (DM), Rudraprayag apprised that 75 KLD STP at Rudraprayag was damaged due to disaster for which the alternate site for relocation of 75 KLD STP at Rudraprayag (near Anoop Negi School) has been identified. He further reiterated that for already existing site there is need of feasibility assessment for landslide protection. District Magistrate further apprised that in the District Rudraprayag, there is need to address the septage overflows from septic tank/soak pits of the households.

Chairman while intervening into the matter directed DGCsto approach Disaster Management Institute for sending a team for the feasibility assessment of the already existing site and get the expert report. Further it was directed SMC Rudraprayag to get technical assessment done and accordingly take appropriate actions for sewage/septage management.

(Actions: SPMG, Jal Nigam, District Magistrate, SMC, Disaster Management Dept.)

ii. Bageshwar:

District Magistrate apprised that sewerage system plan for Bageshwar town has been prepared by the Uttarakhand Jal Nigam, which needs to be submitted to the NMCG through SPMG for sanctioning.

Chairman directed to submit the proposal of sewerage system of the Bageshwar town to NMCG through SPMG for sanctioning.

(Actions: Jal Nigam, District Administration)

iii. Almora:

District Magistrate, Almora updated that there is need of 10 MLD STP to cater the areas of Dawarhat, Chaukhutiya etc.

Chairman reiterated to explore decentralized approach for the treatment of sewage in the identified areas of Almora town and accordingly prepare project proposal.

(Actions: District Magistrate, Jal Nigam)

iv. Pithoragarh:

District Magistrate, Pithoragarh apprised to the committee that at the ITBP colony and SSB colony in Pithoragarh, there is no STP, for which the DPR is under preparation.

From the Dharchula town, the sewage is directly being discharged into Kali River. There is need for sewerage system for Dharchula town under Namami Gange Program, so that no untreated sewage being discharged into Kali River. Also the waste water from the Joljibi and thal town is being directly discharged into the Ramganga River without any treatment. For its treatment the sewerage system can be planned under Namami Gange Program.

For the treatment of bio-medical waste, there is deep burial pits are in place, for its proper disposal, there is need of proper bio-medical waste treatment plant.

Chairman directed to submit the DPR of ITBP colony and SSB colony to NMCG through SPMG. Also Jal Nigam to assess the requirements in Dharchula, Joljibi and the towns and accordingly proposal to be sent by SPMG to NMCG to address untreated sewage disposal in river Kali and Rāmgangā. UKPCB and Health Department to ensure the proper disposal of bio-medical waste of the Pithoragarh town.

(Actions: District Magistrate, Jal Nigam, UKPCB, Health Department)

v. Champawat:

DM-Champawat apprised the need of orientation/handholding support from SPMG-GIZ for the DGC members towards preparation of District Ganga Plan.

It was also apprised that I&D and STP proposal of the Tanakpur town has been prepared and needs to be submitted to NMCG through SPMG for sanctioning.

Chairman emphasised to conduct orientation session for DGC for District Ganga Plan preparation in co-ordination with GIZ. Further it was directed to submit the I&D and STP proposal of Tanakpur town to SPMG for its further submission to NMCG for sanctioning.

(Actions: SPMG-GIZ, DGC, Jal Nigam)

vi. Tehri Garhwal

DM-Tehri apprised that monthly meetings of the DGCs are regularly being conducted. Further for rejuvenation of small streams and for construction of Check Dams, there is need of funds from Forest department as well as from the Irrigation department.

Further there is need of funds for solid waste collection and treatment along the highways. Also the plastic waste generated after shredding can be used for road construction.

Chairman directed that the proposal for rejuvenation of small streams and check dams to be sent to Forest Department and irrigation department for review. For the plastic waste management along the highways, technical options to be explored by UDD/UKPCB in co-ordination with PWD and PMGSY for application in road construction.

(Actions: Forest Department, Irrigation, DGC, UDD, UKPCB)

vii. Pauri Garhwal:

DM apprised that at Kotedwar, boundary wall of the trenching ground needs to be constructed for which the funds are required from the UDD.

For the Solid Waste management at Pauri Srinagar and Kotedwar town, the proposals have been submitted to urban Development Department, but their sanctioning is still awaited. At Rishikesh-Junk swargashram, a comprehensive plan for solid waste management has been prepared.

Further the DPR of Beasi Ghat at Kotedwar has been prepared by the irrigation and needs to be submitted to the NMCG for approval.

Chairman directed to submit the proposal of boundary wall of the trenching ground to UDD for appraisal, so that funds can be met through the State finance commission. Also UDD to expedite the sanctioning of the proposal of Solid Waste management of Pauri Srinagar and Kotedwar town.

(Actions: District Magistrates, UDD)

viii. Haridwar

DM-Haridwar apprised to the committee that for the construction of 01 STP of 08 MLD at Shivalik Nagar, BHEL land is required for which the letter to Hon'ble Minister of heavy industries has been sent.

Further there is need of need of orientation/handholding support from SPMG-GIZ for the DGC members towards preparation of District Ganga Plan of Haridwar District.

Chairman suggested that a written submission may be sent to the Ministry of heavy industry from the Chief Secretary, Govt. of Uttarakhand for the availability of land. Further SPMG-GIZ to provide orientation to the DGC for the preparation of District Ganga Plan.

(Actions: SPMG, DGC, GIZ)

ix. Dehradun:

District Magistrate Dehradun apprised that an innovative pilot project of Zero budget natural farming, organic farming and livelihood for beneficiaries received under Arth Ganga from institutions with a budgetary provisions of Rs 01.00 Cr.

The proposal for setting up of STP plant and sewerage network at Tapkeshwar has been sent to the Urban Development Directorate (UDD).

Chairman suggested to send the proposal under Arth Ganga to SPMG for review and appraisal. Status of Proposal for STP at Tapkeshwar to be expedited by the Urban Development Directorate.

(Action: District Magistrate, UDD)

x. Uttarakashi:

It was apprised to the committee that the proposal of Rs 28.68 Cr. under performance based incentive grants (PBIG) for urban local bodies of Uttarkashi town under second Ganga river basin project was submitted to NMCG for approval and are under appraisal stage at NMCG.

xi. Nainital:

District Magistrates apprised that detailed project report for the "Interception and Diversion of nallas discharging in Gaula river at Haldwani, kathgodam has been submitted to SPMG/NMCG for administrative approval under Namami Gange program.

(Actions: District Magistrates/DGCs)

Agenda 6: O.A. No. 200.2014- M.C. Mehta Vs. Union of India in the matter related to Ganga Pollution and its cleaning etc.

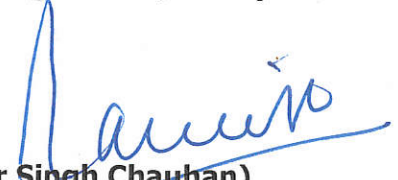
In compliance to the Hon'ble NGT's directions dated 24.11.2023 in O.A. 200/2014, a letter from SPMG dated 15.12.2023 was sent to all the District Ganga Committees for submission of the

compliance report by incorporating the missing information on the above points to the addl. Advocate General, Uttarakhand (Kaushal Pati Gautam) by 15.01.2024, with a copy to the State Program Management Group, Namami Gange, so that same can be vetted and filed well in time before the Hon'ble NGT.

Chairman directed District Magistrates to submit the compliance report to the additional Advocate General at the earliest, so that report can be filed before the Hon'ble NGT.

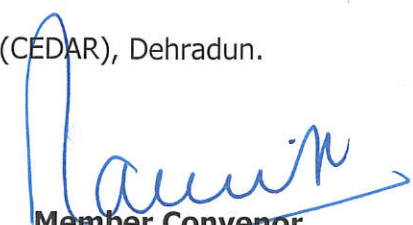
