Note: 1. The utilization capacity of 109 STPs, 47 FSTPs and alternate technology which are being adopted in Rural Panchayats in the State is 67.35 % ie. $\frac{2286.739 \times 100}{3395.469}$

- 2.** The number STPs for the State of Tamil Nadu has been decreased by four numbers as Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board (CMWSSB) has reduced the number of STPs to 20 Nos. (earlier 24 Nos.) Since 4 Nos of STPs have been phased out due to ageing of the plants. The plants which are phased out are listed below:

1. 80 MLD STP Zone – I in Kodungaiyur constructed in 1991
2. 80 MLD STP Zone – II in Kodungaiyur constructed in 1989
3. 23 MLD STP Zone - IV in Nesapakkam constructed in 1978
4. 12 MLD STP Zone – V in Perungudi constructed during 1980.

* In order to carry out the Improvement / Modification work, the capacity of the STP's has been enhanced to 350 MLD (120+120+60+50) with SBR technology to achieve revised PCB norms.

1. 120 MLD STP Zone - I in Kodungaiyur constructed in 2024
2. 120 MLD STP Zone - II in Kodungaiyur in 2023
3. 50 MLD STP Zone - IV in Nesapakkam constructed in 2023.
4. 60 MLD STP Zone - V in Perungudi constructed in 2025

Hence, the existing STPs treatment capacity in MLD for Tamil Nadu is reduced from 2450.980 MLD to 2260.06 MLD due to elimination of the phased out STPs.

Bhavani	The State Ground and Surface Water Resources Data Centre (SG&SWRDC) under the Water Resources Department (WRD) of Tamil Nadu monitors groundwater quality during both the pre – monsoon and post monsoon periods. Groundwater samples are collected twice a year, once in January (Post– Monsoon) and again in July (pre – monsoon), from observation wells and piezometers. Moreover, this department primarily focuses on the analysis of inorganic parameters, with Total Dissolved Solids (TDS) being used as a vital tool in determining the quality of water, classifying it as good, moderate, or poor. Based on the available water Quality data, it can be inferred whether the groundwater in a particular area is suitable for drinking. The groundwater quality in Sirumugai to Kalingarayan stretch in Bhavani River, found that Total Dissolved Solids (TDS) levels ranged from 20 to 1554 mg/L. According to the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS), the acceptable limit for TDS in drinking water is 500 mg/L, and the permissible limit is 2000 mg/L. in general, groundwater quality is good to moderate in condition.

Sarabanga	The groundwater quality in Thathayampatti to T.Konagapadi stretch in Sarabanga River, found that Total Dissolved Solids (TDS) levels ranged from 173 to 2804 mg/L. A DPR has been prepared for rejuvenation of River Thamirabarani and its tributaries amount Rs.1024 Crores by the Environmental cell division, under the control of Plan Formulation Wing Chennai, Water Resources Department and has been submitted to the Engineer -in-Chief and Chief Engineer (General), WRD, Chennai. It is under perusal for onward submission to the Government of Tamil Nadu.

XX. Reuse of Treated Water - DMA

The policy for promotion of use of Treated Waste Water is prepared with a vision to maximize the collection & treatment of sewage generated and reuse treated waste water on a sustainable basis, thereby reducing dependency on fresh water resources. Further, the policy promotes use of treated waste water as an economic resource.

In this regard, Tamil Nadu Government has launched waste water reuse policy during December 2019. At present Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been executed between Urban Local Bodies and the user agency for the re-use of secondary treated effluent water.

XXI. Model River being adopted by the State & Action Proposed for achieving the bathing quality Standards:

Model River Bhavani:

- River Bhavani has been classified as a polluted river stretch based on the monitoring done during 2019 & 2021 and classified under priority - V.
- The monitoring continued until date under the NWMP programme and shows that during the last 5 years the level of BOD value is less than 3 mg/l.
- The reasons attributed for low BOD, high DO is due to low faecal coliforms in the river water.
- Dumping of Municipal Solid Waste along the stretches of Bhavani has been stopped and the guidelines for solid waste management (segregation, recycling, composting, etc.) are followed scrupulously.
- A major polluting industry by name M/s. South India Viscose at Sirumugai- at the bank of the river has been closed permanently by Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board.

- Industries involved in textile dyeing, tannery activities, etc., have provided ETPs with zero liquid discharge systems. The industries shall not discharge treated / raw effluents outside the premises of the units.
- All paper mills located in Sathyamangalam having access to River Bhavani have been made to adopt best practices by way of pulp recovery and reuse of water in their process thereby preventing any discharges leading to the river.
- M/s.Sakthi Sugars Ltd., at Aapakudal in Erode District once permitted for fert- irrigation has been stopped and made to use effluent for composting.
- Under the Swatch Bharat Scheme, the houses in BhavaniSagar Town Panchayat, Sirumugai Town Panchayat, Uratchikottai Villages are provided with septic tanks and soak pit facilities to prevent the discharge of fecal sludge into the river.
- TNPCB has proposed to conduct awareness programme at a cost of Rs.8,00,000/- (Rs. Eight lakhs only) along the Bhavani River stretch.

XXII. Status of Preparation of Action Plans by the 14 Coastal States:

The Government of Tamil Nadu vide G.O.(D) No.193dated:04.10.2023 has issued orders to allot the work of preparation of comprehensive Action Plans to National Centre for Coastal Research (NCCR), Chennai.

The work order of the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board has been issued to NCCR vide this office work order dated: 27.10.2023. The work is under finalization and will be completed early.

XXIII. Regulation of Mining Activities in the State/UT: --

XXIV. Action against identified polluters, law violators and officers responsible for failure for Vigorous monitoring:

In District level the following teams/offices are monitoring the water polluting industries:

- a) District Environmental Committee headed by District Collector concerned.
- b) Joint Chief Environmental Engineer's offices (Monitoring) headed by the Joint Chief Environmental Engineers.
- c) District Environmental Engineer's offices headed by District Environmental Engineers.
- d) Environmental Engineer's (Flying Squad) offices headed by Environmental Engineers.

Illegal industries and law violating industries are closed by the TNPCB or by the District Environmental Committees. The Power supply has also been disconnected to the industries.

In case of violation of TNPCB norms by the CETPs:

- a) All the member units of the CETPs are closed.
- b) Power supply to CETPs and member units are disconnected.

At present two CETPs and member units at Kanchipuram and Sivagangai have been closed by the TNPCB and power supply disconnected.

XXV. IDOL IMMERSION:

The Government of Tamil Nadu in view to maintain public peace, tranquility, public safety, regulation of traffic and control of pollution due to immersion of idols in Rivers notified guidelines in Government gazette and was published on 09.08.2018. Awareness programmes were conducted through District Collectors in all the District headquarters and towns requesting the public to:

- I. Avoid usage of plaster of paris and paints to make the Vinayagar idols.
- II. Encourage the use of clay for making idols as a tradition.
- III. Remove the worship materials like flowers, clothes, decorating materials etc., before immersion of idols.
- IV. Collect bio-degradable materials and to segregate materials separately for recycling or composting and for disposal in sanitary landfills respectively.
- V. Immerse the idols in designated water bodies identified by the District Administration and to follow the Government guidelines scrupulously.

Also, the following actions have been taken by the Government of Tamil Nadu and by Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board.

- a) The Government of Tamil Nadu have issued orders vide G.O. MS No.765 public (law and order) Department date 30.08.2021 to obey the Hon'ble Supreme Court orders in case No.11366/2020, 11467/2020, etc., regarding idols immersions and celebrations of festivals.
- b) To implement the Hon'ble NGT orders in OA no. 135/2023 dated: 24.01.2024 a committee has been constituted by the Government of Tamil Nadu and the committee have issued certain guidelines for celebrating the Vinayagar Chaturthi festival peacefully and the same guidelines have been followed in the State.
- c) The Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board published idols immersion locations district wise. Guidelines of Central Pollution Control Board, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Department May 12th 2020 notification have been published in local newspapers for creating public awareness during August 2024.
- d) The Board monitors water quality of the said water bodies before & after immersion of idols. During 2022 – 2023 & 2023 – 2024 water samples have been collected and analysed.

XXVI. SEDIMENTATION POLICY - STATUS AND INITIATIVES TAKEN UP AT STATE LEVEL

For reservoirs and dams in Tamil Nadu, quantity of silt deposited has been quantified and the desilted quantity is arrived. In general, the top layer is allowed to farmers for taking sediments containing silt at free of cost as per G.O Ms. No.50 (Industries Dept.,) Government of Tamil Nadu. The balance quantity of the sediment is desilted and the sediment is used for bund formation as and when required. In the case of forest areas, the State Forest Department permission is obtained for desilting.

In the State in ten reservoirs/dams viz., Mettur, Amaravathi, Pechiparai, Vaigai, Srivaikundam, Vidur, Parapalar, Gundar, Ramanadhi and Willington have been proposed for desilting. Some of the works are under progress.

XXVII. Additional Polluted River Stretches – 2022

The CPCB has identified Cooum (Priority – I), Adyar (Priority- I), Amaravathi (Priority – V) and Palar (Priority-V) Rivers as additional Polluted River Stretches during 2022. The Action Plans for Palar and Amaravathi have been approved by River Rejuvenation Committee and are under implementation. Copies of Action Plans for Palar and Amaravathi Polluted River Stretches have been furnished to CPCB and MoJS, GoI during October 2024 for reference.

The Action Plan for River Cooum and Adyar were submitted for approval in the River Rejuvenation Committee meeting held under the Chairmanship of the Additional Chief Secretary, Environment Climate Change and Forest Department, Govt. of Tamil Nadu on 16.04.2025 and

River Rejuvenation Committee has approved the Action Plan for River Cooum and Adyar for onward submission to Central Pollution Control Board after incorporating certain details from Rural Development & Panchayat Raj department. The Additional Chief Secretary, Environment Climate Change and Forest Department, Govt. of Tamil Nadu also reviewed the execution and current implementation status of all other 10 Polluted River Stretches in Tamil Nadu.

For rejuvenating Cooum, Adyar and Buckingham Canal the Government of Tamil Nadu has issued principal approval for Rs. 2371 crore. Accordingly, the Government of Tamil Nadu has sanctioned Rs.1001 crore in phase - 1 to carry-out improvement works in Cooum and Adyar Rivers and the works have been completed except for a few.

Also, the Government of Tamil Nadu vide G.O.(Ms) No.50, Municipal Administration and Water Supply (MW) dated 14.03.2024 has issued Administrative and Financial Sanction for the restoration of Adyar River in “Hybrid Annuity Model” by carrying-out pollution abatement works. For implementation of the above Government order preliminary works have been initiated. Municipal Solid Waste/ Sewage outfalls have been intercepted diverted and treated in MSW facilities/STPs.

So, apart from the preparation and implementation of Action Plans for Polluted River Stretches in the State the Special Purpose Vehicles of the State have commissioned many improvement works so as to improve the water quality of the Polluted River Stretches.
