**DIRECTIONS UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE ENVIRONMENT (PROTECTION) ACT, 1986
(Notice Thereof)**

WHEREAS, in exercise of powers conferred under sub-section (1), read with clauses (i), (ii), (v), (vi), (vii), (viii), (ix), (x), (xii) and (xiii) of sub-section (2) and (3) of section 3 and sections 4, 5, 9, 10, 11, 19, 20 and 23 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, the Government of India constituted the National Mission for Clean Ganga (hereinafter NMCG) by the River Ganga (Rejuvenation, Protection and Management) Authorities Order dated 7th October, 2016 (hereinafter the Order) for the purpose of exercising powers and discharge functions as specified under the Order for effective abatement of pollution and rejuvenation, protection and management of the River Ganga and its tributaries; and

WHEREAS, as per Section 3(ze) of the Order, "tributaries of River Ganga" means those rivers or streams which flow into River Ganga and includes Yamuna River, Son River, Mahananda River, Kosi River, Gandak River, Ghaghara River and Mahakali River and their tributaries or such other rivers which National Council for Rejuvenation Protection and Management of River Ganga may, by notification, specify for the purposes of this Order; and

WHEREAS, as per Section 8 read with section 41(3) of the Order, NMCG has been empowered to issue such directions as it may consider necessary for abatement of pollution and rejuvenation, protection and management of the River Ganga and its tributaries, under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, to the concerned authority or local authority or other authorities or Board or Corporation or person and they shall be bound to comply with such directions; and

Whereas, amongst others, under Section 17 of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, one of the functions of the State Pollution Control Boards (SPCBs) and Pollution Control Committees (PCCs), constituted under the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 is to plan a comprehensive programme for prevention, control or abatement of pollution of streams and wells in the State and to secure the execution thereof;

Whereas, 51.4 MLD treated effluent being discharged from 13 operational CETPs in Delhi is also responsible for deteriorating water quality of river Yamuna.

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AND NOW, THEREFORE, in view of the above and in exercise of powers conferred to NMCG under the Order, following directions under Section 5 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, are issued to Delhi Pollution Control Committee for compliance:-

- i. CETP occupier shall send back the treated wastewater from CETPs to member units for re-utilization. Remaining treated wastewater should be mandatorily sold for use for non-potable purposes such as industrial process, railways & bus cleaning, flushing of toilets through dual piping, horticulture and irrigation etc. No treated wastewater to be allowed to discharge into river Yamuna.
- ii. CETP occupier will submit a list regarding existing potential water bodies in their vicinity for utilization of CETPs treated waste water with identified agency so that concerned department can be approached for use of treated for rejuvenation of these water bodies.
- iii. Flow meters shall be installed in all the individual units in industrial clusters and inlet/outlet of respective CETPs for measurement of influent/effluent volume.

The Delhi Pollution Control Committee shall evolve economical and reliable methods for optimal utilization of CETPs infrastructure and reutilization of treated wastewater in consultation with NMCG, DDA, DJB and GIZ.

The Delhi Pollution Control Committee shall direct the CETP occupiers to submit a time bound action plan for compliance of the above directions.

The Delhi Pollution Control Committee shall acknowledge the receipt of this direction within 10 days and shall submit Action Taken Report to NMCG within a month from the date of receipt of the aforesaid directions.
