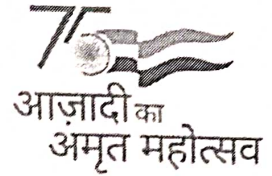



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- b) **Capacity Utilization of existing STPs:** update awaited from the department after household connectivity of STPs located at Rangpo and Gangtok Zone II is completed.
- c) **MLD of sewage being treated through Alternate technology:** Nil
- d) **Gap in Treatment Capacity in MLD:** The total capacity of STPs located in urban areas is 22.02 MLD currently. There treatment capacity is currently higher than the sewage generation i.e. 18.79 MLD. In rural areas the gap in treatment capacity is 28.89 MLD. However most households do have individual septic tank connectivity to ensure untreated sewage is not discharged into the open. In implementation of Swacch Bharat Mission Gramin Phase II, installation of septic tanks for individual households in 64 villages are under process. Work order to renovate STPs in Gangtok and extension of sewer network and extension of sewer network to uncovered areas in Gangtok has been awarded to contractor. Shri B.B. Burman, Advisor, NCRD, MoJS visited Gangtok during September, 2021 to assess the current status of existing and proposed STPs in Gangtok. Minutes of the Meeting of the visit has been forwarded to the Advisor by PHED department. Domestic Sewage management has been included in State & District Environment Plans, which has been approved by the State Government and the same is available at <http://www.sikkimforest.gov.in/index.html>. Work to renovate STPs in Gangtok and extension of sewer network uncovered areas in Gangtok has commenced.

- **Treatment Capacity of all TSDFs:** There are no TSDF in the state. All HW generated in the state is transported to Haldia, West Bengal for disposal. The SPCB-Sikkim has also granted permission to cement plants in Assam and Meghalaya for co-processing and Refinery, West Bengal for recycling.
- **Avg. Quantity of Hazardous waste reaching the TSDFs and Treated** – 1394.494 MT transported to Haldia for treatment & disposal, 645.721 MT transported to cement plant in Assam for co-processing and 26.98 KL transported to West Bengal for recycling in the year 2020-21.
- **Details of on-going or proposed TSDF:** The Department of Commerce & Industry, Government of Sikkim has released 90% of the cost for acquisition of land selected for CHWTSDF.

**VII. Plastic Waste Management:**

- **Total Plastic Waste generation:** 82.75 tonnes per annum (2020-21 annual report)
- **Treatment/ Measures adopted for reduction or management of plastic waste:**

- a) The Govt. of Sikkim vide Gazette notification no. 145 dated 8th of July 1998 amended the Sikkim Trade License and Miscellaneous Provisions Rule 1985 wherein the use of plastic wrappers or bags for purchase of any goods or materials was prohibited.
- b) Fine mechanism is notified under state bye-laws and The Sikkim Non-Biodegradable Garbage (Control) Act, 1991. Also notification no. 344 dated:13.08.2019 has been notified for ban on sale and use of plastic having less than 50 micron thickness and single use plastic.
- c) The Govt. of Sikkim vide notification number 25/Home/2016 dated 19.05.2016 directed that the packaged drinking water bottles may not be used in any Govt. meetings/functions in order to reduce plastic waste.
- d) The Govt. of Sikkim vide notification number 26/Home/2016 dated 19.05.2016 announced the ban on sale and use of disposable items made from Styrofoam throughout the State keeping in view its various ill effects to environment and human health.
- e) In addition, no application has been received by the SPCB-Sikkim till date for establishment of manufacturer of plastic bags.
- f) NOC has been granted to NGOs to collect domestic plastic waste and channelize to appropriate recyclers.
- g) Bins have been installed in the collection vehicles for separated collection of recyclable plastic by registered scrap collectors.
- h) Utilization of Plastic for road construction project has been initiated by NHIDCL in Rorathang area, Pakyong District. (Gangtok Municipal Corporation – 1101 kg, Namchi Municipal Council – 300 kg, Nayabazar-Jorethang Nagar Panchayat – 500 kg, Gyalshing Nagar Panchayat -312 kg)
- i) SPCB-Sikkim is in receipt of application from seven brand owners for setting up collection facility in coordination with ULBs.
- j) SPCB-Sikkim has initiated registration of local plastic packaging brand owners for which market survey has started.
- k) Directions have been issued to industries for registration of producers, importers and brand-owners under the Plastic waste Management Rules, 2016.

- l) Compilation of registration of brand owners of single use plastic (SUP) is under process.
- m) Committee has been constituted for steering the modalities of carrying out field and market surveys for phasing out SUPs.
- n) State Level Task Force for elimination of SUPs and preparation of comprehensive action plan in mission mode has been constituted.
- o) As per the directions of the CPCB vide F.No. B-17011/UPC-II-PWM(SUP)/2021/4212 dated 29/07/2021 the SPCB has conducted sensitization and capacity building programme for phasing out of SUPs to various stakeholders and councilors of ULBs.
- p) Awareness Programme for PIBO, Distributor, Whole seller & Waste Management Agency on EPR of Plastics was conducted by SPCB-Sikkim on 30/11/2021
- q) Comprehensive byelaws and action plan of all the 7 ULBs for plastic waste management has been prepared and is under process of approval.
- r) State-wide Plastic Waste Awareness Week from 6<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> March, 2022 was launched at Samman Bhawan on 5<sup>th</sup> March, 2022 by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Sikkim Shri Prem Singh Tamang.
- s) Notice for prohibiting manufacture, import, stocking, distribution sale and use of SUP was brought out by SPCB on 10/03/2022 in local newspapers.
- t) Notice brought out by SPCB on 10/03/2022 to inform all concerned that CPCB has setup an exclusive centralized portal for registration PIBOs and PWP in local newspapers.
- u) SPCB-Sikkim, has distributed awareness material for phasing out Single Use Plastics in English Poster for all Govt. schools, Nepali Poster from all Govt. Offices, Stickers for all Govt. and Private Vehicle, Pamphlets for each household in the State, Banner for all district forest check post, and radio jingles and awareness video for Social media platform.
- v) The SPCB-Sikkim in association with Inner Wheel Club of Gangtok organized Women's Marathon on 27<sup>th</sup> March 2022 with a motto "I am Running to Say No To Single Use Plastic"

**IX. Identification of polluting sources including drains contributing to river pollution and action as per NGT order on insitu treatment:**

Inventorisation of non point sources such as Hotels & Commercial establishments under the directions of the Hon'ble NGT in the matter of O.A. 400/2017 Westland Green Farms Vs. Union of India& Ors which was taken up by SPCB has been completed. The inventory has been submitted to CPCB. The data submitted was for establishments that were open and operating during lockdown. The monitoring for remaining enterprises has been stalled due to resurgence of COVID-19 cases although the matter has been disposed off by the Tribunal. Respective licensing authorities have also been informed.

Currently no bore well or ground water abstraction is practiced in any of the catchment area on the polluted river stretches.

**XIII. Ground water regulation:**

Utilization of ground water for domestic purposes is not practiced in the state. All industries that are abstracting ground water have been granted permission by Central Ground Water Authority. No new application for borewell has been received from any industrial unit. Guidelines for preparation of GIS based water conservation plans and inventory of water bodies in the districts under the Jal Shakti Abhiyan: Catch the Rain Campaign.(JSA:CTR) campaign has been forwarded to the concerned authorities for information & onward action.

SPCB-Sikkim has directed all industries abstracting ground water to conduct water quality analysis by NABL accredited laboratories on quarterly basis and submit the same to the Board.

#### **XIV. Good irrigation practices being adopted by the State:**

Utilization of ground water for agricultural purposes is not practiced in the state. Dhara Vikas or spring shed development under the Rural Development Department programme has been focusing on the dry areas for effective use of rain water. Water Resource Department is executing 156 Nos. of Surface Minor Irrigation (SMI) Schemes under PMKSY (AIBP) in the State of Sikkim, sanctioned under the Ministry of Water Resources, Ganga Rejuvenation and River Development Government of India as per the information provided by Water Resources Department, Government of Sikkim.

#### **XV. Rain Water Harvesting:**

The NOC issued by CGWA for abstraction of ground water includes condition for installation of rain water harvesting system by the industrial units. The land survey have been conducted by CGWA officials but the installation of said system is underway for all industries. In the matter of O.A. No. 325/2015 Lt. Col. Sarvadaman Singh Oberoi Vs. UOI, the Rural Development Department has carried out the following activities:

1. Construction of 1489 water harvesting tanks of capacity 40 KL in 13 drought prone areas under National Adaptation Fund for Climate Change (NAFCC).
2. Construction of 72,900 water harvesting structures for rainwater recharge of 4374 ponds
3. Work for revival of 7 hilltop lakes have been under taken out of which 4 have been completed and 3 are under process

#### **XVI. Demarcation of Floodplain and removal of illegal encroachments:**

There are no flood plains in the state of Sikkim.

#### **XVII. Maintaining minimum e-flow of river:**

E-Flow meters have been installed in the following Hydro Electric Projects (HEPs) of the four river stretches:

- a) **Maney Khola (Adampool to Burtuk Stretch)** – NO HEPS in this stretch
- b) **Rangit River (NHPC dam site to Triveni)** : 96 MW Jorethang Loop HEP, South Sikkim & 97MW Tashiding HEP, West Sikkim
- c) **Rani Chu ( Namli to Singtam)**: 510 MW Teesta Stage V, Balutar, East Sikkim & 115MW Madhya Bharat Power Corp. Ltd., Nimitar, East Sikkim.
- d) **Teesta (Melli to Chungthang)**: 99MW Chujachen HEP (2 nos), East Sikkim, 1200 MW Teesta Stage II HEP, 96MW Dikchu, HEP North Sikkim

#### **XVIII. Plantation activities along the rivers:**

The Environment & Soil Conservation Division, Forest & Environment Department has submitted action plan for further conservation activities that shall take place under



the guidance of River Rejuvenation Committee. Plantation along with engineering works has been proposed for rejuvenation of the four polluted river stretches.

**XIX. Development of biodiversity park:** Matter has been apprised and information awaited from implementing department.

**XX. Reuse of Treated Water:**

All industries requiring ETP are directed to maintain Zero Liquid Discharge in their premises. Treated effluent is to be utilized in cooling towers, irrigation of green belt, evaporation or flushing purposes. To ensure that no effluent is discharge all pharmaceutical units in particular have installed CCTV in drain outlets of their premises as per the directions of the SPCB-Sikkim and footage is submitted to SPCB on weekly basis.

**XXI. Model River being adopted by the State & Action Proposed for achieving the bathing quality standards:** Maney Khola, East Sikkim

The River Rejuvenation Committee has been notified as Nodal Agency for protection of all water bodies in the State by Govt. of Sikkim vide Ref No. 205/GOS/F&ED/SECY dated 21/01/2021. First meeting for the same was held on 28/01/2021. Status Report on Implementation of Action plan has been sought from line departments for further submission to the CPCB.

Action Taken Report on Status of Implementation of action plans submitted in compliance to the Hon'ble NGT orders in O.A. 673/2018 in the matter of 'News item published in the Hindu authored by Shri Jacob Koshy titled ' More River stretches are now critically polluted: CPCB', with Dr. Tudi Indrasena Reddy & Ors. Vs. UoI & Ors. for delisting of the four polluted river stretches in the state of Sikkim has been submitted on 02/08/2021

As per the directions of the MoEF&CC, Public notice has been issued in local newspapers on Idol Immersion guidelines before festival/puja season.

**XXIII. Regulation of Mining Activities in the State/UT:** overseen by Department of Mines & Geology. Collection of loose boulders and loose sand are being undertaken under the supervision of the Department of Forest & Environment, Government of Sikkim.

**XXIV. Action against identified polluters, law violators and officers responsible for failure for vigorous monitoring:**

1. Grievances have not been received in the month of March, 2022 in the NMCG portal.
